


# All Saints Upton CE Primary School

### Playtime Snacks

One issue brought up by parents is the morning snack provision. After due consideration, it has been decided by the Governors that toast will no longer be available to the children at morning play from January. This decision has been taken because of concerns nationally about children's health and the organisation of the toast which prevented the children from being as active as they could be during playtimes. Milk will still be available for your child to buy at morning break. Children are also welcome to bring in a piece of fruit from home, but no other snacks such as cereal bars, biscuits or crisps please. Further snack details will be provided before the end of term.

### A Message from our School Nurse

Please make sure that your child brushes their teeth twice daily for two minutes. (The children can time it themselves by humming the Happy Birthday tune four times whilst brushing!) Brush

at least 30 minutes after breakfast to avoid spreading sugar around and don't rinse with water as this removes the fluoride protection. Remember – a can of coke contains 14 teaspoons of sugar! Encourage your child to drink water or milk between meals instead.
