The people heard a voice telling them they had built their fire too close and would burn the ants.

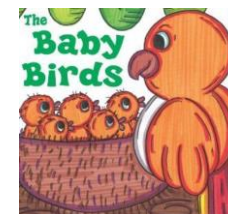
The Prophet told them that no matter how small or big all animals are important and should be looked after.
